Further comments

Thinking about sustainable development what single change would most improve your Quality of Life as a resident of our villages

The top comments followed the theme of the overall survey results in that residents considered that there should be no development or limited development. Although many did not want housing development, a proportion of comments specifically referred to an improvement in the range of local shops with a Farm Shop, Takeaways and a Garage all being mentioned. In the survey of Holly Meadows School Students takeaways/ fast food was a top request.

Poor broadband service was a major concern across all parishes and unlikely to be resolved by NHP policies on new development.

Echoed throughout the responses to relevant open questions was the desire for improved community facilities to accommodate a wider range of clubs and sporting activities, from the comments most saw this in a new centre and improvements to Hudson Fen, although a smaller number of responses suggested the school.

Residents indicated their frustration with speeding, but also felt the volume and type of traffic was an issue, many also wanted better a better-quality footpath infrastructure both for leisure and connectivity.

Better public transport in particular a bus to Fakenham and later buses back from King's Lynn, although in the main survey 70% stated that they did not use public transport.

Parish specific comments that could be followed up outside of the NHP process

Roydon - A request that the Station Road Post Box in Roydon was relocated as it was slippery in the wintertime and overgrown in the summertime

Grimston -There were 9 comments relating to on street or poor parking, several of these comments related to the GP's surgery and to outside the Post Office
